Overview

Keeping up to date with new guidelines for the treatment and prevention of cardiovascular disease can be difficult for the primary care provider. Many community primary care physicians and cardiologists request updates regarding specific treatment options and prevention care. This program will serve this population's need for updated information about cardiovascular disease. Knowledge will be shared by a cardiologist in a small interactive group setting, featuring case study discussions with ample question and answer time.

Target Audience

This series is designed for family practitioners, internal medicine physicians, cardiologists, advanced practice nurses and registered nurses.

Objectives

At the completion of this grand rounds series, participants should be able to:

- Identify risk factors of cardiovascular disease,
- List treatment goals for patients with risk factors for cardiovascular disease,
- Assess and identify patients at risk for sudden cardiac death,
- List possible treatments for patients with chronic and paroxysmal atrial fibrillation, identify patients with symptoms of peripheral vascular disease,
- Identify treatment options for patients with PFO in the setting of cryptogenic CVA,
- Explain the spectrum of new treatments for patients with heart failure, and
- Identify new imaging techniques for the diagnosis and treatment of coronary artery disease.
