Overview

Oncology is a medical field in which changes occur so rapidly that it is difficult for physicians and nurses caring for cancer patients to keep up with developments in related subspecialties such as Medical Oncology, Radiation Oncology, Gynecological Oncology, and Surgical Oncology, even if they have been trained in a particular subspecialty. At the national and international levels, the need for multidisciplinary collaboration has been well recognized, and national and international conferences have brought the subspecialties together to exchange ideas. At the patient-care level, there is a need for subspecialties within oncology to discuss and develop a consensus on clinical management. However, it is often difficult, during clinic hours, to get members of these subspecialties together to discuss individual cases. By convening Friday conferences of faculty experts in surgical, medical and radiation oncology, as well as basic scientists to discuss individual cases, KU Medical Center believes that cancer treatment and management plans will be broadened by providing a forum where oncologists interested in providing better care and service to patients will learn appropriate practical management skills. This conference series also serves as an avenue to review standards, and National Comprehensive Cancer Network (NCCN) guidelines for the treatment of malignant diseases.

Who will receive an eeds card?

- KUMC and non-KUMC participants qualifying for continuing education credit will receive an eeds card.
- KUMC residents and fellows will receive an eeds card.
- All other participants will complete the FY07 "Participant Registration Form and Sign in Sheet" and date and initial their form at each session attended. (They will not receive an eeds card.)

How do I get an eeds card?

- Initial cards will be requested from KUMC Continuing Education by the department providing the grand rounds. Departmental administrative assistants will receive eeds cards for distribution. One card will be issued for attendance at all KUMC accredited regularly scheduled conferences and grand rounds.
- Replacement cards must be ordered online by the participant at www.eeds.com at their own expense (currently \$5 plus postage). Participants may receive a replacement card for the cost of postage only by completing an online continuing education needs survey.

What if I don't have my card?
